The undersigned Trustees in their Second Report of Sales, report that after complying with all the requisites of the decree as stated in their first Report of sales filed in this cause they first advertised for more than three successive weeks the Lands decreed to be sold in the Republican Citizen, Frederick Examiner and Valley Register, newspapers published in Frederick County giving notice of the time place manner and terms of sale and by hand bills extensively circulated, that on Tuesday the 26th day of February in the year 1874 at 10 o'clock they attended at the late residence of Otto F. Harley deceased in Petersville Election District in Frederick County the time and place of sale and offered at public sale to the highest bidder Lots Nos. 19 & 20 being part of a tract of Land called "The Resurvey on Maryland" being the remaining portion of that tract known as the "Philpot Farm" situate in Frederick County State of Maryland containing One hundred and sixty one Acre and One perch and described in the table of courses and distances made by William H. Killiany surveyor and filed as an Exhibit in No. 3788 Equity Circuit Court for Frederick County but receiving no sufficient bid for the same withdrew the sale of said property. Your Trustees then offered at Public Sale to the highest bidder all those parts of two tracts of Land situate in Petersville District in said County and State being parts of a tract of Land called "The Resurvey on part of Uncle Gift" and of the "Forest of Hedwood" and described as Lot No. 2 in the Plat filed in this cause and containing 83 Acre 1 Rood and 9 Perches of Land and it also being the residue of the "Home Farm" not assigned to Catharine Harley the widow of Otto F. Harley as dower and sold the same reserving the growing crops to Samuel Shalt at and for the sum of Ninety dollars and fifty cents per Acre upon the terms prescribed by the decree he being the highest and best bidder for the same, we further report that Samuel Shalt has signed the Memorandum of Sale herewith exhibited marked No. 1 but has not yet complied with the terms of sale. The Report states the amount of Sales to be \$7539 21, all of which is respectfully submitted
