Testimony

At the execution of the annexed Commission issued out of the Circuit Court for Frederick County and to me directed and empowering me to examine evidences in the cause therein depending between William A Troxell by Isabella A Troxell his mother and next friend as Complainant and Elizabeth Troxell as Defendant, I William J Nelson Commissioner therein named did on the 13th day of September A. D. 1875 at my Office in Frederick City Maryland and in the absence of J. E. R. Wood Commissioner then and there proceed to take the following testimony to wit:

The Complainant filed with the Commissioner as evidence Exhibits Nos 1 2 3 & 4 which are herewith returned by the said Commissioner.

Whereupon there being no witnesses present to be examined and further time being required for the production of evidences the said Commission was adjourned to the 15th day of September A. D. 1875 at which time and at the place aforesaid and in the absence of John E. R. Wood Commissioner I then and there proceeded to take following depositions to wit:

Amos J Morris a witness of lawful age produced upon the part of the Defendant being duly sworn and examined to Interrogatories filed with the Commissioner by the Complainant and herewith returned deposes and says, to the 1st Int. I have known all the parties for some years, they reside in Creagerstown District Frederick County Md.

2nd Int. I did know him well, he is dead, he died on his homestead in Creagerstown District Frederick County Md during last winter, he resided during his lifetime on his homestead in Frederick County Md.

3rd Int. He left a widow named Isabella A Troxell, and the following children namely William A Troxell an infant under the age of twenty one years and Elizabeth and Frederick D Troxell adults, and they all reside in Frederick County Md.

4th Int. He left no will.

5th Int. He left Real Estate in Creagerstown District Frederick County Md containing about 250 or 260 Acres of Land divided into two farms or rather two tracts in one farm, one the homestead containing about 140 Acres which is tolerably good land worth about \$20 per acre, The other 114 Acres is of poorer quality and worth about \$10. per acre Exhibits Nos 1 2 3 & 4 properly describe the Real Estate of which the said Abraham Troxell died seized and possessed.

6th Int. It is not susceptible of advantageous division among the parties concerned and it would be for the benefit and advantage of all parties interested
