The joint and separate answer of John W Fogle and Louisa his wife to the original and amended bills of complaint of William Pratty Thompson against them and others in Chancery exhibited
These Respondents now and at all times hereafter saving and reserving to themselves all manner of benefit of exceptions to the manifold errors uncertainties and imperfections in the said bills of complaint contained for answer thereto or to so much and such parts thereof as they are advised it is material for them to answer, answer and say that they admit that a certain Peter Cutsail late of Frederick Co decd did by his last Will and Testament duly executed to pass Real Estate and dated on the 31st day of May 1827 among other things devise and bequeath to Mary Cutsail the one third part of his farm wherein he then resided called "Hoab" containing 150 Acres of Land more or less and after her death or in case of her marrying then he bequeathed the same one third part of his said farm to his youngest daughter Sallie Cutsail to her the said Sallie and the heirs of her body lawfully begotten but in case of the death of said Sallie without lawful issue then he gave and bequeathed the said one third part of his farm above mentioned to his seven other children as set forth in the Complainants Exhibit No 1 filed and exhibited in this case

These Respondents further admit that the said Mary Cutsail the widow of the said Peter Cutsail renounced the provisions of said Will as set forth in the said bills of Complaint of Complainants

These Respondents further admit that the said Mary occupied about 50 Acres of the said farm "Hoab" up to the date of her death, and that the death of the said Mary occurred some time in the year 1868 but your Respondent further says that the said Mary Cutsail occupied the said one third part of the said farm called "Hoab" during her life as and for the one third part thereof devised to her youngest daughter Sallie Cutsail notwithstanding her renunciation of the Will of her said husband and that the one third part so occupied by her was laid off as such third part by Henry Star the Executor of the last Will and Testament of the said Peter Cutsail.
