

6<sup>th</sup> Inter. You have said in answer to the last preceding Interrogatory that on the occasion of the signing and acknowledging of the Deed by Benjamin Todd, he said nothing to you in reference to the signing and acknowledging of the same, or in reference to the business that brought you to his house from what then do you make up your opinion that said Benjamin Todd understood the purport of the paper he was signing and acknowledging before you?

Answer. I made up my opinion from the fact, that nothing was said on the occasion but he seemed prepared for all emergencies.

7<sup>th</sup> Inter. You have said in answer to the 4<sup>th</sup> Cross-interrogatory that Rachel D. Todd in putting the Pen into the hand of said Benjamin Todd, and placing his hand to the place where it was to sign the Deed; was prompted by the physical infirmities of Benjamin Todd do you mean to say that it was so, or only that it might have been so?

Answer. There is no supposition on my part, I believe so.

8<sup>th</sup> Inter. What distinction do you make between supposing it to be so, and believing it to be so?

Answer. I believe so because to see the act, I do not know what motive he had except to assist his brother who was both blind and infirm.

9<sup>th</sup> Inter. You have said in answer to the 10<sup>th</sup> Cross-interrogatory, that Mrs. Ruth Crow when Mrs. Todd appeared to her on the purport of said Deed, did you have any conversation with her or she with you, in reference to the signing and acknowledging of said Deed, or in any way in reference to the business that brought you to her Husband's house on the occasion of the signing and acknowledging of said Deed?

Answer. No, Sir.

10<sup>th</sup> Inter. Can state in answer to the 11<sup>th</sup> Cross-interrogatory, that the Parties in question, the parties present on the occasion of the signing and acknowledging said Deed included Mrs. Todd appeared to be waiting for and expecting you, please state particularly what it was that made that impression upon your mind, especially in reference to Mrs. Todd now Mrs. Ruth Crow one of the Complainants in this Cause.

Answer. The impression was made upon my mind from the manner in which Rachel D. Todd, met me at the Door of Benjamin Todd and ushered me through the Parlour room, to the one back of it where Mr. and Mrs. Todd were sitting and the manner in which they received me; When Rachel Todd met me at the Front Door, he was expecting me about that time, for I told him I would be there about that hour.

11<sup>th</sup> Inter. Do you, or do you not know that Benjamin Todd and his wife were expecting you and do you, or do you not undertake to swear that the said Benjamin Todd and Ruth Todd his wife were expecting you?

Answer. I cannot answer that question definitely; my supposition, was that Rachel D. Todd had told Benjamin at least, if not Benjamin his wife that I was coming.
