The joint answer of Edward M. Intire and Josephine E. M. Intire his wife to the Bill of Complaint of Samuel S. Moritz against them and others on Chancery exhibited. These Defendants know & but all times reserving unto themselves all and all manner of Exceptions to be had or to be taken to the money and manifest errors and imperfections in the said Bill of Complaint contained, for answer thereto or to so much of such such parts thereof as they are advised it is material & proper they should answer, answering say. They admit that this defendant Edward M. Intire did on the 27th day of July 1874 execute to the Complainant a mortgage upon the Property described in Exhibit No. 1, as alleged in said Bill of Complaint.

They also admit that the time limited for the Payment of the debt secured by said Mortgage has expired and that said debt has not been paid by these Defendants and further answering these Defendants admit that on the 13 day of April 1871, this Defendant Edward M. Intire executed to Joseph H. J. Henry, H. J. J. and Rufus Woods (Partners trading under the name style and firm of J. H. & P. Brothers and Company) a Mortgage upon the same Real Estate described in said Exhibit No. 1, to secure the Payment of the sum of Nine Hundred and seven Dollars & fifty Cents and that the said Mortgage was executed in Baltimore City before a Justice of the Peace in and for said City and before him acknowledged by this Defendant Edward M. Intire, and these Defendants admit that there was not and has not been attached to the Certificate of acknowledgment afforded to said Mortgage a Certificate of the Clerk of the Superior Court of Baltimore relative to the official Character of said Magistrate.

And these Defendants further answering say they deny that the said sum of nine hundred and seven Dollars and fifty Cents was not when said Mortgage was executed, and they aver that said sum was then and still is due, and that no part thereof hath been paid.
