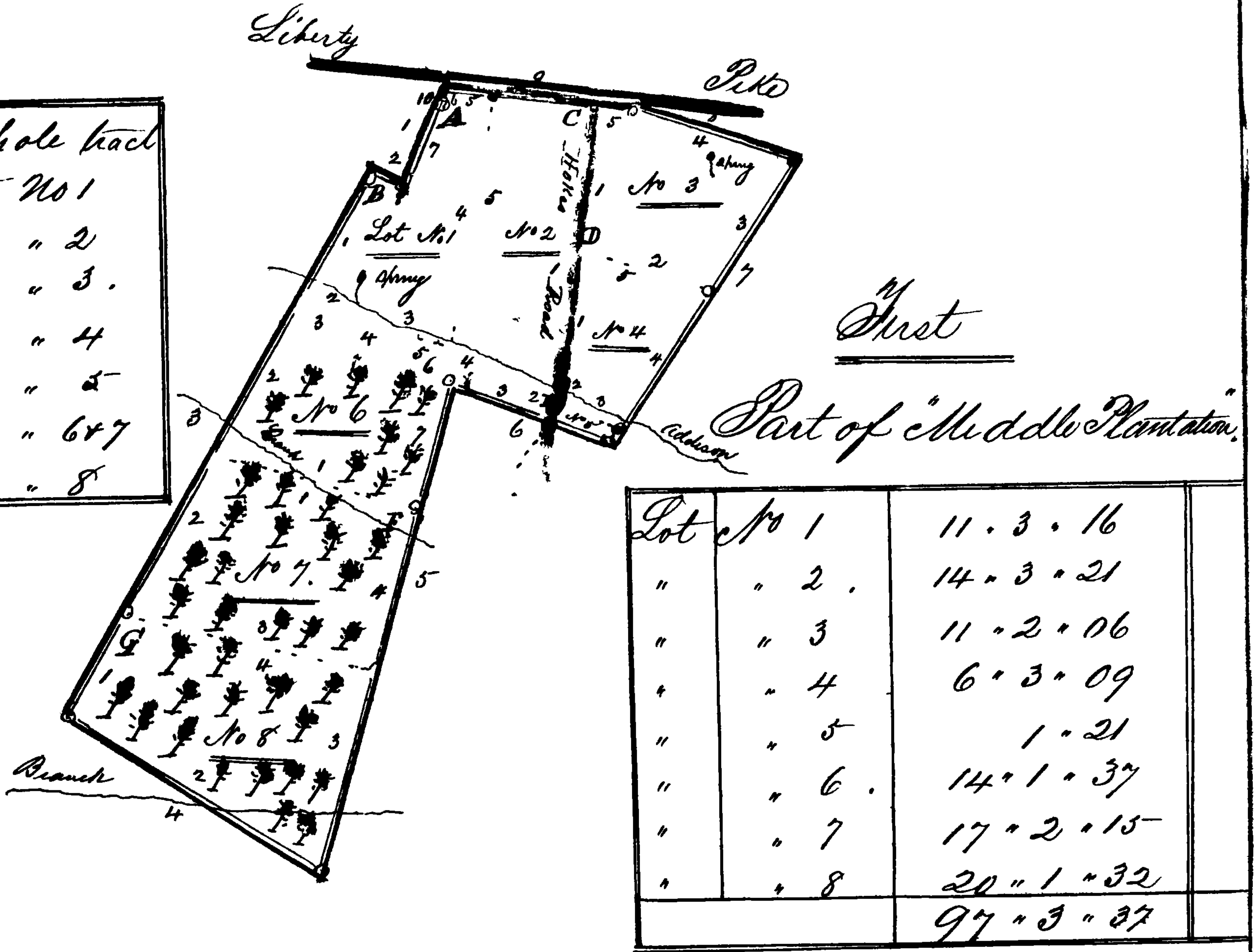

Part of Lot No. 2, part of "The Resurvey on Mackay's Luck". Beginning for the same at a stone formerly planted at the end of 44 ¹/₂ perches on the 8th line of "The Four Friends", granted Joseph Hardman, September the 25th, 1752, and running thence with said land 3 Courses and distances, correcting the same for variation in order to agree with the former location, North 8 ¹/₄ degrees West 19 ¹/₂ perches to a stone No. 12. North 25 ³/₄ degrees East 24 perches to a stone No. 13. North 13 ³/₄ degrees East 50 ³²/₁₀₀ perches to stone No. 14. then North 86 degrees West 61 ²⁴/₁₀₀ perches to the beginning of John W. Burner's lot part of said lot No. 2, thence with said Burner's lot three courses and distances, South 14 ¹/₂ degrees West 39 perches to a stone formerly planted in the North margin of the Liberty Turnpike Road and with the North side thereof, South 78 ¹/₂ degrees West 63 ⁶/₁₀ perches to a stone formerly planted, North 1 ¹/₂ degrees West 53 ¹/₂ perches to intersect the 4th line of C. H. Rodwell's survey of said lot No. 2 in the year 1866, and with said 4th line North 86 degrees West 35 ¹/₂ perches to the end thereof, then with the 5th line, South 4 ⁷/₁₆ degrees West 61 ¹⁶/₁₀₀ perches to the North side of an inlet granted by the same
