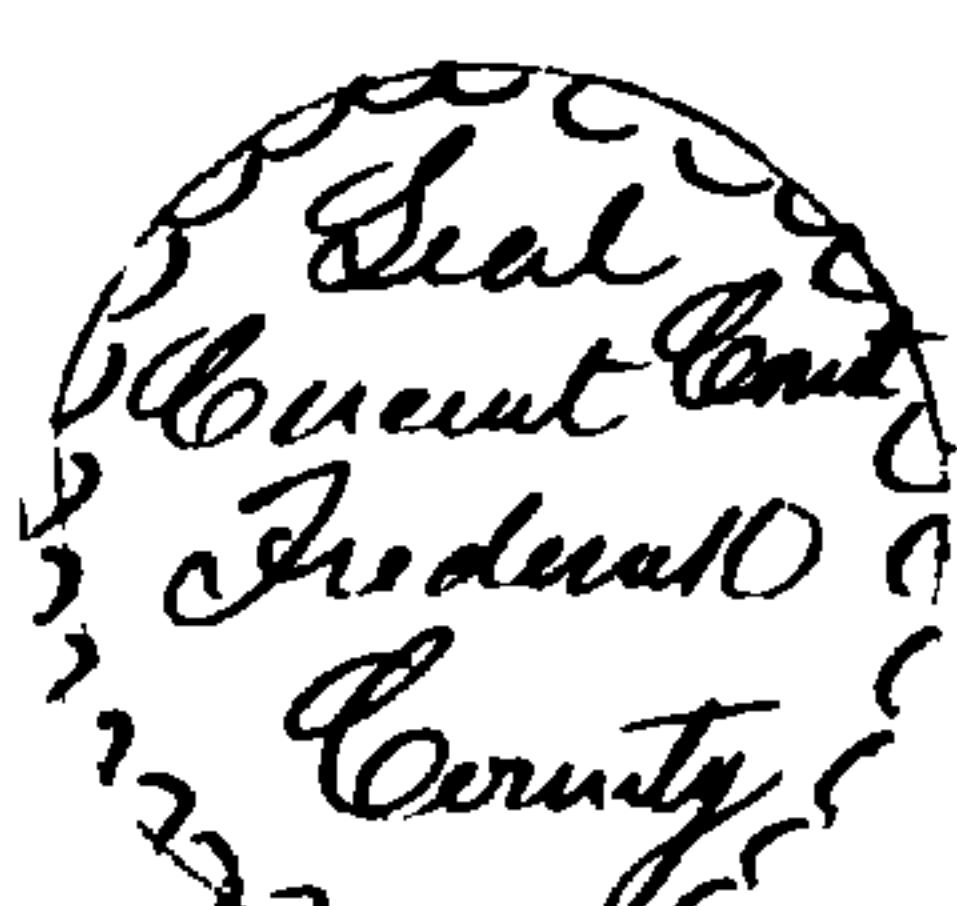

Deed was recorded Nov. 20th 1852. ^{Rec'd 41. Stamp duty} ^{Edw. Thomas Clerk}

This indenture, made this 23rd day of April, in the year of Our Lord Eighteen hundred and fifty two, between Margaret Ellen Dulany, of Frederick County, in the State of Maryland, of the one part, and Joshua Brown of Anne Arundel County, of the State aforesaid, of the other part, Witnesseth, that for and in consideration of the sum of five hundred and fifty four dollars eighty four and half cents, current money by the said Joshua Brown to the said Margaret Ellen Dulany, in hand paid at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt of which she doth hereby acknowledge the said Margaret Ellen Dulany, hath bargained and sold, aliened and conveyed, and by these presents doth give, grant, bargain and sell, alien, release, release, convey and confirm unto the said Joshua Brown his heirs and assigns, one moiety, or all of her undivided part of a tract of Land called "Carolina", resurveyed for Mesheak Agatt April 24th 1787, it being part of the same land was conveyed to Hamilton Steu by Montjoy B. Luckett and Grayson Eckelberger, Trustees, by their deed, as referred to said deed will more fully and at large appear - Beginning for the outlines of said land now intended to be conveyed at a stone planted, it being the original place of beginning of "Carolina", and running thence by and with the outlines thereof, making such corrections as are found necessary to agree with the former locations the four following courses and distances, to wit: S. 35 1/2° N. 49 yds. to a stone at the end of the 41st line of a tract of land called "Dorsey's Search", and with said land, the three following courses, correcting as aforesaid, S. 57° N. 60 yds S. 32° N. 86 yds. S. 43 1/4° N. 15 1/2 yds. to meet the end of the 3rd line in a deed from Joseph Wood, Trustee to Hamilton Steu, then with the 3rd & 2nd lines reversed in said deed to wit: - S. 67° E. 18 yds. S. 28° N. 18 yds. it being in the middle of the Turnpike Road, S. 67° E. 70 7/10 yds. N. 72° E. 3 yds. it being at the end of the 6th line in said deed first herein mentioned from M. B.
