At the request of John Smith the following Deed was recorded February 28th. 1842

This Indenture, made this twenty second day of February, in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and forty one, between Adam Shank and Mary Barbara Shank, his wife, of Washington County, and State of Maryland, of the one part and John Smith of Frederick County, and State of Maryland, of the other part; Witnesseth, that the said Adam Shank and Mary Barbara his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of Five Hundred and fifty dollars, current money of the United States, to them the said Adam Shank and Mary Barbara, his wife, in hand paid by the said John Smith at or before the executing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof the said Adam Shank and Mary Barbara, his wife, do hereby acknowledge and thereof do release acquit, and discharge the said John Smith, his heirs, executors and administrators by these presents they the said Adam Shank and Mary Barbara his wife, have granted, bargained and sold and by these presents do grant, bargain and sell unto the said John Smith his heirs and assigns forever, a tract or parcel of land lying and being in Frederick County, and State of Maryland, being part of a tract of land called "Sweetstakes", beginning at a bounded white oak tree, the beginning of a tract of land called "White Oak Ridge", and running thence with the first line of said land, South thirteen degrees West two perches and one half of a perch to the twenty eighth line of a tract of land called "Forrests Purchase", South seventy nine degrees East ninety five perches to the end of said line, then with the twenty ninth line thereof, North eighty six degrees East thirty two perches and three fourths of a perch to the sixty seventh line of "Sweetstakes", then with that line, North twenty six degrees and one half of a degree East one hundred and ten perches to a stake and stones in a line drawn S. 68° E. from the end of the 7th. line of "White Oak Ridge" aforesaid,
