Interrogatories to be proposed: Jacob Stetely of D. and John H. Locke Competent Witnesses produced by and in behalf of Complainant and sworn

- 1st Interrogatory - State your name and residence
 - 2^d Interrogatory - Do you know parties to this suit and their residence, if yes, state it and whether they are all adults - if not, name the infants?
 - 3^d Interrogatory - Did you know Benjamin Strine, if yes, how long and is he living or dead, if dead, when and where did he die, and has he a widow, living?
 - 4th Interrogatory - Did the said Benjamin Strine leave any children surviving him, if yes, give their names, and are they still living, and are any of them married, if yes, to whom and are they still living, and where.
 - 5th Interrogatory - Did the said Benjamin Strine die intestate?
 - 6th Interrogatory, Did the said Benjamin Strine die seized and possessed of any real estate in Frederick County, Maryland, if yes, look at the papers herewith filed as Exhibits A and B. and show you, and say whether that was the real estate of which he died seized and possessed; Also state about how many acres he had - Give its value
 - 7th Interrogatory - State whether or not said real estate is susceptible of division among the above named children of Benjamin Strine without great loss and disadvantage?
 - 8th Interrogatory - State whether or not it would be to the interest and advantage of the said infants and the other heirs of the said Benjamin Strine to have said real estate sold and the proceeds distributed among them - Give all your reasons.
