

Fick. Because he wouldnt speak to me and I heard him make such threats towards me, and I didnt think it was safe to go about him and therefore I got others to go.

15th. C. Int: Why was it more dangerous for you to offer said John M. Fick his legacy, than to give him his wife's legacy?

Ans: Because his wife's legacy had been given to him, the day it was appraised and he had not made threats at that time  
16th. C. Int: If his wife's legacy was given by you to him said John M. Fick at that time, how was it that she refused to accept it, and you gave it to her husband afterwards and he received it?

Ans: Because she said the will was false, it was my getting up

17th. C. Int: If you are and have been willing to pay said legacy due John M. Fick, why did you not upon the institution of these proceedings, pay the same to your Executor, or into Court for said John M. Fick?

Ans: Because no body requested it. I didnt suppose the Court would accept it

18th. C. Int: You have stated, in your examination in chief, that John M. Fick owed you and your brother James about \$120 - Have you any memorandum or account of same, and for what was said debt owing?

Ans: Not with me. In different work that was done, and things that were got from us and occasionally money loaned

19th. C. Int: Did you, as Executor of James M. Fick, make return of said indebtedness of John Fick to James Fick to the Orphan's Court and collect the same? If not, why not?

Ans: I made a return of it to the Orphan's Court, but didnt collect it, because I couldnt.

John C. L. Ans: I did. Joseph Fick told me to go to John Fick and tell him that his money was ready for him. That was when the first \$100 - by this will was due him. I went to him and told him his money was ready for him. - & that Joseph Fick said that he should find for it, or send an order or receipt by somebody for it. When I told him
