- 1st Do you know the Parties to this suit, and if yea, how long have you known them?
- 2^d. Did you know Jared Hanks late of Frederick County, and if yea, is he living or dead, and if dead, when and where did he die?
- 3^d. Did said Jared Hanks, die testate or intestate?
- 4th. Did said Jared Hanks leave a widow now living, and if yea, what is her name, age and Condition of health?
- 5th. Did said Jared Hanks leave any Children or other heirs at law, and if yea, what are their names, ages and Places of residence. Are they married or single, and if married, give the names of their husbands and wives?
- 6th. Do you know the real estate of which said Jared Hanks did seign and possessed, and if yea, look at Exhibits 1. 2. 3 & 4, and state whether or not, said Jared Hanks did seign & possessed of the real estate therein described? Give the quantity and value of said real estate, fully and particularly.
- 7th. State whether or not, the said, real estate will admit of partition among the Children and heirs at law of said Jared Hanks, without injury and loss. State all your knowledge with reference thereto, and give fully your reasons for your opinion?
- 8th. State whether or not it would be to the benefit and advantage of said Children and heirs at law, infants as well as adults, for said real estate to be sold, and the proceeds distributed among them? State fully your opinion with reference thereto and your reasons therefore?
- 9th. Do you know anything further that would be of advantage to the Complainants in this case, and if yea, state the same fully?
