Decree of Court Geo W Bowen vs Addison White and Others No 4003 Equity In the Circuit Court for Frederick County, as a Court of Equity May Term, 1875.

The above cause standing ready for a hearing, and being submitted, the Bill answer, Exhibits and all other proceedings were by the Court read and considered. It is therefore this 22nd day of May A. D. 1875, by the Circuit Court for Frederick County, as a Court of Equity, adjudged, ordered and decreed, that the Deed executed on March 4th, 1874, by Addison White and Dorcas A. White his wife, to Mr. B White, and filed in this cause as Exhibit No. 4, be and the same is declared void, vacated and annulled - and it is further adjudged, ordered and decreed, that the said land and premises mentioned in these proceedings be sold, and that C. H. Wood of Frederick County, be and he is hereby appointed Trustee to make the said sales, and that the course and manner of his proceeding shall be as follows: he shall first file in the Clerk's Office of this Court a Bond to the State of Maryland, executed by him with a surety, or sureties, to be approved by the Court, or the Clerk thereof, in the penalty of One Thousand Dollars, conditioned for the faithful
