And the said Elizabeth Grumm being by us privately examined apart from and out of the hearing of her husband; "whether she doth make her acknowledgment of the same willingly and without being induced thereto by fear or threats of or ill usage by her husband, or fear of his displeasure," acknowledges that she doth make her acknowledgment of the same willingly and freely, and without being induced thereto by fear or threats of, or ill usage by her husband or fear of his displeasure.

This Deed made this fifth day of February in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty two, between Jacknah Clagett of Washington County, and State of Maryland, of the one part, and Hezekiah Botter, son in law and Methen Botter daughter of the said Jacknah Clagett of the other part. Witnesseth, that the said Jacknah Clagett as well for and in consideration of the natural love and affection which he the said Jacknah Clagett hath and beareth unto the said Hezekiah Botter and Methen Botter as also for the better maintenance support livelihood and preferment of them the said Hezekiah Botter and Methen Botter hath given granted, aliened, enfeoffed and confirmed and by these presents doth give grant, alien, enfeoff and confirm unto them the said Hezekiah Botter and Methen Botter their heirs and assigns, a part of a tract of land called Keptree, part of King Cole, and a part of Grum's Discovery, beginning to include said parts at a stone standing at or in an old road at the end of a line that runs, South fifty one degrees East thirty nine and an half inches of a deed from
