The object of this suit is to procure a decree for the sale of the real estate of which Ezekiah Botter did seized and possessed for the payment of his debts, and the distribution of any surplus among the parties entitled thereto. The Bill states that said Ezekiah Botter was in his lifetime indebted unto the Complainant in the sum of two hundred dollars on his single Bill dated on the fourth day of April A. D. 1872 payable one month after date with interest from date and said single Bill is filed as an Exhibit to the bill of Complaint. The Bill further states that said Ezekiah Botter was also in his lifetime indebted unto the Complainant in the sum of forty dollars and thirty eight cents an account, an itemized copy of which account is filed as part of the Bill of Complaint. The Bill of Complaint further states that said Ezekiah Botter was in his lifetime also indebted unto divers other persons in large sums of Money and being so indebted died intestate in the month of August A. D. 1876, leaving real estate and some personal property, and leaving surviving him a widow Margaret Botter, and adult living in Frederick County, a daughter Elizabeth, now the wife of Charles Gross, both adults living in Frederick County, a daughter Louisa Stearns, an adult living in Frederick County, a daughter Matilda now wife of Stephen Balch, both adults and now residents of the State of Maryland, a daughter Isabella now wife of Pastor Marshall, both adults non residents of the State of Maryland, a daughter Ann H. now wife of Thomas Clayett, both adults, now residents of the State of Maryland, a son Robert H. Botter whose wife is named Margaret Botter, both adults, living in Frederick County, a son William E. Botter the Complainant, whose wife is named Sydney W. Botter, both adults living in Frederick County, a grandson George H. Botter an infant living in Frederick County, the only child of Zachariah S.
