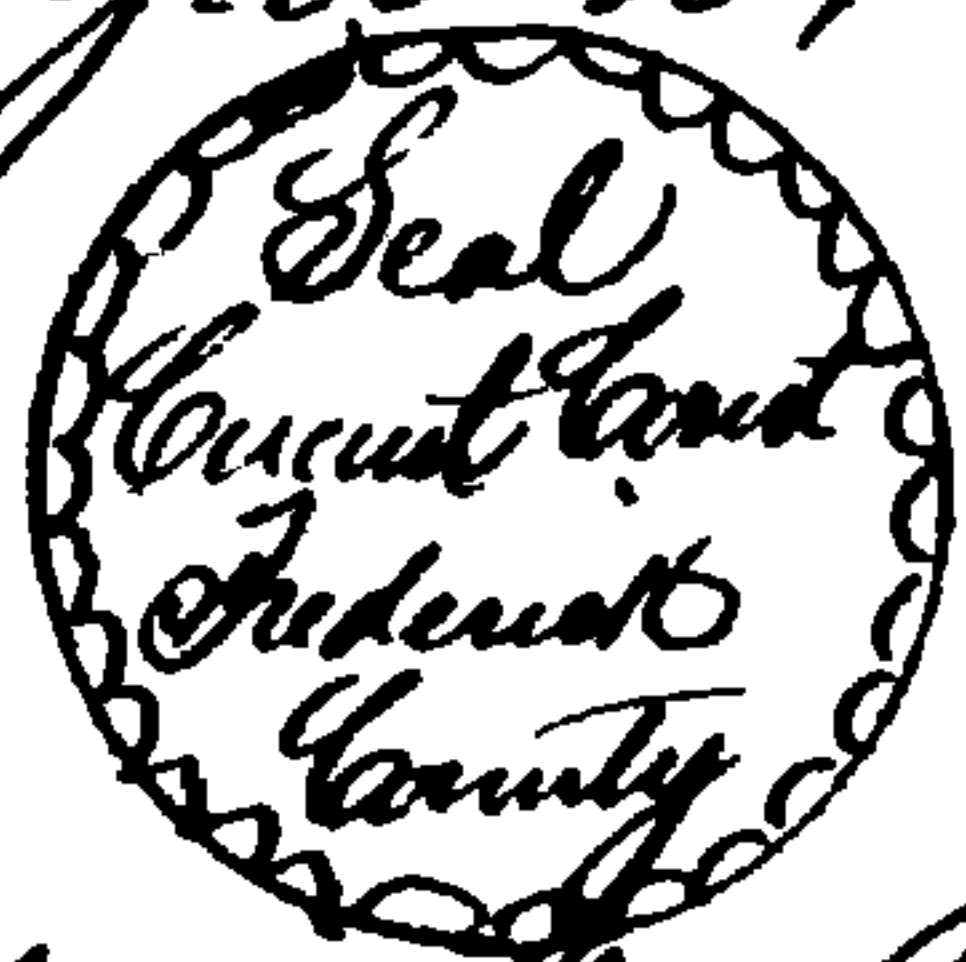


Subpoena
