

ment and that it will be to the interest and advantage of all the parties, infants as well as adults to have said property sold and the proceeds divided as the property is not susceptible of partition or division among the said devisees. It states that said parties are all adults except Charles Myers and Ellen Myers, who are infants under twenty one year of age, and that the Defendants reside in the State of Maryland except the said Charles Myers and James P. Lowell and Kate Lowell his wife, who are non-residents thereof. The Bill prays for a decree for the sale of the property and an order of publication against the non-resident Defendants. It is thereupon this 5th day of December A. D. 1876, Ordered by the Circuit Court for Frederick County, sitting as a Court of Equity that the Complainants cause a copy of this order, together with the object and substance of the bill to be inserted in some newspaper published in Frederick County, once a week for four successive weeks before the 10th day of January next, giving notice to the Defendants in said bill, warning them to appear in this Court in person or by solicitor or by guardian on or before the 11th day of April next to show cause, if any they have, why a decree should not pass as prayed.

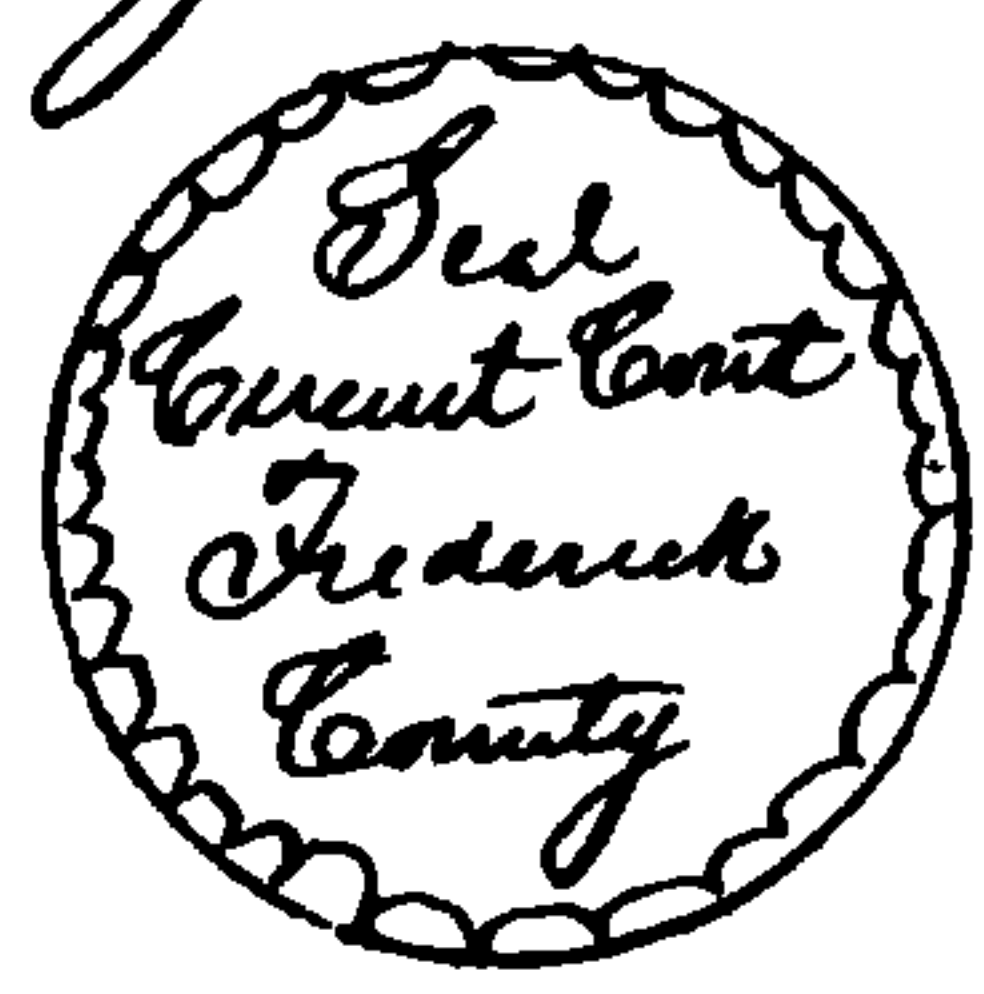
