 are as follows James P. Lowell, John M. Lowell, Rosa Cooper,
 Ellen Kolb and Charles B. Lowell who were living at death
 of William Lowell, James resides in State of Virginia, John in
 State of Pennsylvania, Mrs. Rosa Cooper, in Baltimore City, Mary-
 land, her husband's name is Edey Cooper, Charles B. Lowell
 resides in Baltimore City. He had a daughter Catherine
 Myers who died before her father, in the State of Pennsylvania, leaving
 a child whose name is Charles Myers he is about twelve years old

 and Mary B. Kolb, they reside in the State of Maryland.
