

2nd I look at the paper now shown me marked Exhibit B. I know the property therein described. It is situated on South Street It adjoins the land of Lewis Beyerly on the East and the lot of Mrs Hooper on the West and runs back to the Rail Road

3rd I did know Mr Lowell. He is dead He died April 14th 1876.

4th. He left a will

5th. He died seized and possessed of the property described in Exhibit B. on South Street heretofore described

6th. He left five children living and a child of a deceased daughter who died about five years ago. James P Lowell, who lives in State of Virginia, John W Lowell, who resides in State of Pennsylvania, Rosa Cooper married to Edly Cooper living in Baltimore, Maryland, Ellen Kobb who died since her father, having three children, John W Kobb, James A. Kobb, and May B Kobb, who reside in State of Maryland, and one all three infants Charles B. Lowell who also resides in Baltimore, Maryland, and the child of his deceased daughter Catharine Myers, whose name is Charles Myers, he resides in the State of Pennsylvania

7th. It cannot be divided. Because it is impossible to divide it among the heirs without a sale

8th. Yes Sir Charles Myers son of Catharine Myers deceased is an infant, and the three children of Ellen Kobb are infants.

9th. It would be to the interest of all the heirs, infants as well as adults to sell the property, and divide the proceeds, because it has already depreciated very much in value and is getting worse daily, and no body is keeping it up, and the sooner sold the better for them all

M. E. Doll, a witness of lawful age produced on the part of the Complainant being duly sworn to Interrogatories filed with the Commission by the Complainants and herewith returned deposes and says.
