To the Honorable the Judges of the Circuit Court for Frederick County, sitting as a Court of Equity
Humbly Complainung sheweth unto your Honor by this annexed Bill of Complaint, your Orator Charles Myers and your Oratrix Ellen Myers by Abraham A. Myers, their guardian, and your Orator John W. Lowell and your Oratrix Kate Lowell, his wife, by leave of the Court here first had and obtained in this behalf, that since the filing of the Original Bill of Complaint in this cause which is made part hereof and is prayed to be so considered as fully as if the same were herein again repeated, and at large set forth, a certain Ellen Kolb, one of the Defendants named in said original bill has died leaving her husband Minrod O.
