

9th Int. He was indebted to me in the sum of \$42⁵⁰, with interest from the 4th December 1875, on a Promissory note. Such indebtedness has not been paid, nor any part thereof.

10th Int. I look at "Exhibit No 2." now here shown me. Said Exhibit is a true copy of the promissory note I held against said Calvin Fowler. I herewith file with the Commission the Original promissory note marked "Exhibit G. J. D."

11th Int. Sworn as to this defendant

D. Columbus Kemp, a witness of lawful age, produced upon the part of the Complainant, being duly sworn and Examined to Interrogatories filed with the Commission by the Complainant and herewith returned, to the

1st Int. D. Columbus Kemp, aged about 34 years and I, reside in Frederick County, Maryland,

2nd Int. I know all of the parties to this suit and have known them all for 15 or 20 years

3rd Int. I did. He is dead. He died in Frederick County, Md; on the 5th day of October A. D. 1876.

4th Int. He died intestate.

5th Int. He left a widow who is now living and whose name is Sarah E. Fowler aged 23 years, in good health and residing in Frederick County, Md.

6th Int. He left one child, named Ariadne E. Fowler, who is an infant under 21 years of age and who resides in Frederick County, Maryland.

7th Int. He did. A house & lot in Frederick District, Frederick County, Md, containing about one and five eighths of an acre of land and worth above 200⁰⁰ -

8th Int. I look at "Exhibit No 1." now here shown me. said Exhibit properly describes the real estate of which the said Calvin Fowler died seized and possessed

9th Int. Sworn as to this deponent.

11th Int. He left about ten dollars worth of personal property - His personal property is not sufficient to pay his debts - There has been no administration on his personal estate, because it was not sufficient to pay the expenses of administration. There are other debts, besides Complainants, to the amount of about \$125⁰⁰

There being no other witnesses present to be examined and no further time being required for the production of evidence, the Commission closed the said Commission and herewith returns the same under his hand and seal, on this 8th day of February, A. D. 1877.
