Ebbots the said sum of One Hundred and Ninety two Dollars and Fifty two cents mentioned in said Audit as a deficiency due because of the resale of the property mentioned in these proceedings

Jones, consisting of Household & Kitchen Furniture, Horses, Wagons, Carts and Farming implements - Also all book accounts, Choses in action, and all his personal Estate wheresoever situate, reserving however such amount of property as may by law be exempt from Execution.
