To the Honorable the Judges of the Circuit Court for Frederick County, sitting in Equity: Your Petitioner Thomas Perrill of Frederick County, State of Maryland, respectfully sheweth unto your Honors that a certain Thomas Perrill, late of said County and State deceased, in his life time on the 16th day of April 1859, made his last will and testament in due form of law, and died on or about the 6th day of August 1860 without leaving the said. Your Petitioner further sheweth that the said testator by his said last will devised as follows to wit: "I give and devise unto my Brother Philip Perrill, for & during his natural life only, the house and lot, part of a tract of land containing ten or more acres of ground, which I purchased from Rebecca Hopkins, the said house and lot hereby intended to be devised, being in Frederick County, Maryland, and now in the occupancy of the said Philip Perrill. And after the death of the said Philip Perrill, then I give and devise the said house and lot to my said Wife Mary Ann Perrill her heirs and assigns, in trust to sell the same as soon after the death of the said Philip Perrill as may be practicable, and upon such terms and conditions of sale as my said wife may deem most advisable, and then to divide, distribute and pay over the money or proceeds arising arising from such sale as follows: Namely - the one half of the said proceeds of sale to my respected friend the said Burchar'd Pillingor, and should he die before I die, or before receiving the said moiety of said proceeds of sale, then, in trust, to pay the same to such person or persons as the said Burchar'd Pillingor may by last will and testament or by deed appoint and designate to take and
