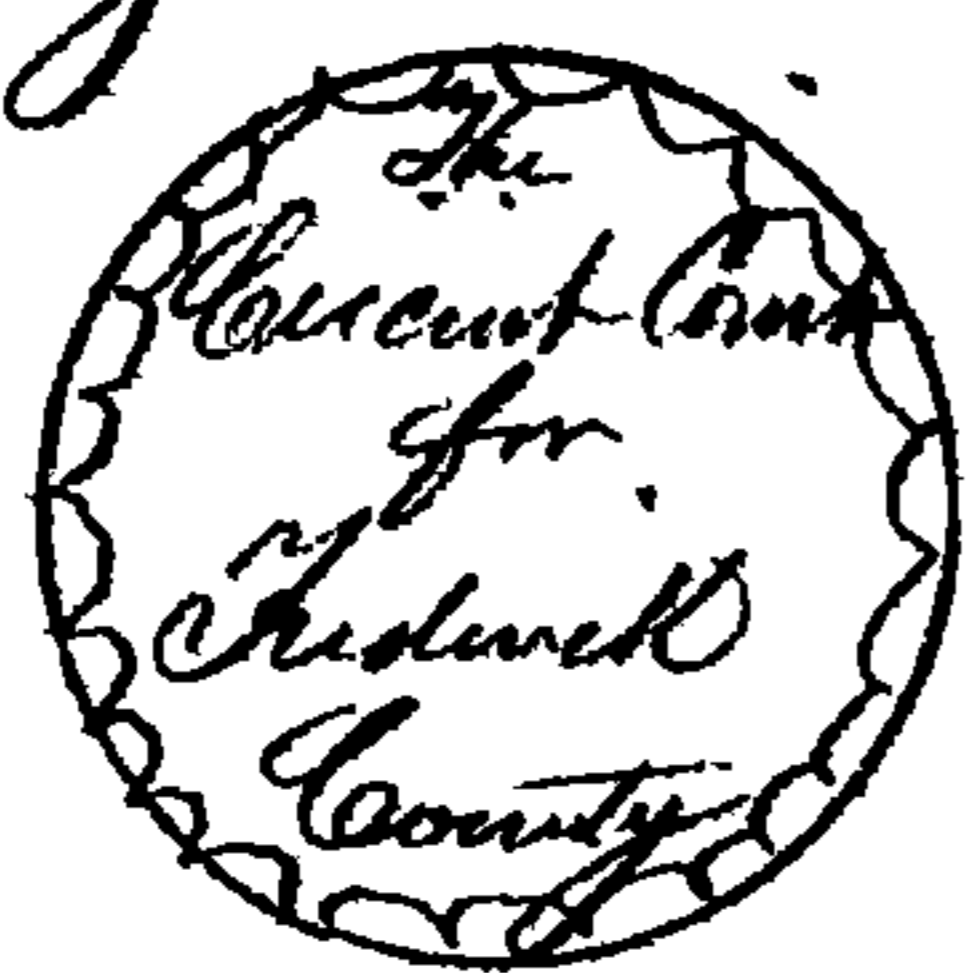


Subpoena Maryland, Oct. The State of Maryland.



To John W. Sefton & William Sefton of Frederick County, Greeting.

You are hereby commanded that all excuses set apart, you personally appear before the Judges of the Circuit Court for Frederick County, sitting as a Court of Equity, to be held at the Court House in Frederick Town, in and for said County, on the Third Monday of February next, to answer the bill of complaint of Leonard R. Waeseh, James J. Waeseh and Albert Forman, trading as Waeseh Bro. & Co. against you in said Court exhibited, and so forth. And if you fail you not, as you will answer the contrary at your peril.

Witness the Honorable Richard J. Bowie, Chief Judge of our said Court the 8th day of December 1873.

Answer of Wm. Sefton

The answer of William Sefton of Frederick County, State of Maryland, to the Bill of Complaint of Leonard R. Waeseh, James J. Waeseh and Albert Forman, Partners trading &c, as Waeseh Bro. & Co, of Frederick County, State of Maryland, filed in the Circuit Court for Frederick County, as a Court of Equity, against himself and one John W. Sefton, this Defendant for answer to the said Bill of Complaint, answers and says, that he admits the Complainants to be partners as alleged in said Bill of Complaint. This Defendant further admits that the legal title in the real estate mentioned in said bill of complaint is vested in this Defendant as is alleged in said Bill of Complaint. This Defendant denies that the Complainants within the time limited by law, or at any other time prior to the filing this Bill of Complaint, either verbally or in writing gave notice to this Defendant of their intention to file this claim, for work done and materials furnished, and of their intention to claim the benefit of the lease on said building. This Defendant further states that he has no personal knowledge of the contract to build said house on said premises as alleged by said Complainants and demands full proof of the same. Without the &c, and this Defendant prays hence to be dismissed with his cost and charges in this behalf sustained.
