

Ans: "Mr. William Sefton, you are hereby notified, that we intend taking a Mechanics Lien upon the Property of John M. Sefton, of which you hold the deed". Signed "Wessche Bros & Co."

30th, Int: When was the \$1700 to be paid you by John M. Sefton?

Ans: Well, he was to do \$600 worth of hauling & the balance he said he would try and raise when the house was completed, or shortly after.

31st, Int: When was possession thereof to be delivered?

Ans: When the house was completed.

32nd, Int: Who is in possession of the same now and when did he take possession?

Ans: John M. Sefton is in possession now - He took possession sometime in January 1872, prior to its completion.

33rd, Int: When was the money for the extra work and charges to be paid to you?

Ans: There was nothing said at the time.

34th, Int: What money has been paid to you, or your firm, on the contract?

Ans: None at all.

35th, Int: What is the amount of hauling to which John M. Sefton is entitled to receive credit on your claim as filed in this case?

Ans: From the books I have here, I make the amount \$844.58.

36th, Int: The amount credited in claim as filed, is by hauling - \$868.60 - Can you assign any reason for the discrepancy? And if you, state it?

Ans: Ephraim Carmack made out the account and made the addition I gave him the whole thing itemized on paper as it stands on my books and he added it up & made that sum.

37th, Int: When you contracted for the building of the house and whilst you were building the same, who was regarded by, and reputed in the community at large, to be the owner of the said lot?

Ans: John M. Sefton.

1st, Q. Int: How long have you resided in Mechanicstown?

Ans: Since May 1867.

Ans: Charles E. Cassel.

4th, Q. Int: Has the firm of Wessche Bros. & Co. any interest in said claim for which this suit is instituted?
