Ans: Yes Sir. He was to haul stone and sand for the Building that I was putting up about town - There was nothing said about anything else at that time.

60th C. Int: Was he by your agreement, to haul whatever you directed him to haul, and was the materials, he was to haul for \$6. per day.

Specified?
Ans: He was to do any hauling that I asked him, or wanted him to do - Anything that he was to haul, that we otherwise didn't agree upon, was to be \$6. per day.

61st C. Int: If he hauled with a cart, what was he to receive per day for that?

Ans: There was nothing said in regard to the price of hauling with a cart.

62nd C. Int: Now the items you took from Mr. Sipton's Book and entered into your books, the same as contained in Mr. Sipton's Book?

Ans: The number of days hauling that he did with his team was put down on my book, as I took it off of his Books, at that time, There were some others that I know of put down on my Book exactly as they were on his, because the wood hauling that he did to the hands was given in to me by him and I charged the hands with it. The number of the days work that he did and was done about the house, ~~and~~ the masons, and hauling water, and the work of the masons in putting up the chimney, and the boarding the masons, I put on my books the same as he had it on his books.

63rd C. Int: With what team or how did he haul the wood?

Ans: With his own team - three mules and a horse, or animals of some kind. That was a separate contract for hauling, by the cord, \$1.50 a cord. I think there was a little wood from a different lot that \$2. a cord was agreed on.

64th C. Int: You say that it was the contract, that he Sipton was to haul the wood for \$1.50 per cord - When and where was said contract made, and where was said contract made, and who was present at the time said contract was made?

Ans: I don't remember the exact point where it was made. It was before Sipton began to haul the wood and before I bought the wood from Rough. I don't know whether any body was present or not.

65th C. Int: Was it or not, part of the contract in the building of said house, to put up the cellar stairs?

Ans: It was the outside stairs.

66th C. Int: Did you estimate of material contain material to put up the cellar stairs?

Ans: It did - the outside ones.

67th C. Int: Was any material used in putting up the cellar stairs, for which extra charge of \$10. is made?

Ans: Certainly we had to use materials to put up the steps.
