

8th. Int: What was a fair reasonable price for a four horse team, driver and an additional hand per day, in your neighborhood, at the time you speak of, hauling lime, stone, sand and wood?

Ans: \$7.50 - \$6. for the team and \$1.50 for the extra hand.

To Cross - Interrogatories filed with the Commission by the Complainants & herewith returned, the said John A. Fleagle deposes and says, to the -
1st. Q. Int: Did you do any hauling for the Complainants at or about the time, that the Defendant John W. Sefton was hauling for them?

Ans: Yes Sir, a little - not a great deal.

2^d. Q. Int: What was the size and Character of your team and the number of hands that went with it and the price you charged.

Ans: A three horse team and myself or driver. I charge \$4.50.

3^d. Q. Int: Did you notice the size and Character of the loads hauled by John W. Sefton, and what were they as compared with those hauled by yourself?

Ans: I didn't notice them, but sometimes he had very big loads on when the roads was good, and when the roads was bad, he had small loads on - Well, I suppose they would compare favorably, making allowance for the difference in the teams.

4th. Q. Int: Did you or not say to Mr. L. R. Maesche, that the amount you hauled in a day with your team, was as great as that hauled by Mr. Sefton with his?

Ans: I might have said it, but I don't recollect it if I did.

5th. Q. Int: Did you not haul wood for Mr. Weigel from the same spot, from which Mr. Sefton hauled wood for Mr. Maesche?

And, if yes, what did you charge per cord?

Ans: To my knowledge I never hauled Mr. Weigel a cord of wood, nor to his place. Now I hauled for myself 11 or 12 cords from that place Mr. John Rouzers lot.

To Re-direct Interrogatories filed with the Commission by the Defendants and herewith returned, the said John A. Fleagle deposes and says, to the -

1st. R. Q. Int: When you hauled for Maesche, Bro. & Co. was there any difference in the places respectively hauled from by J. W. Sefton and yourself? And, if yes, state where you hauled from and where Sefton hauled from?

Ans: He hauled lime from the same place I did - When he had wood he'd haul it out of the mountain. I hauled no wood for Maesche out of the mountain. We both hauled stone from where we could get it and both hauled from pretty much the same places.

2^d. R. Q. Int: Where was your hauling principally confined to, and where was Sefton's hauling principally confined to?

Ans: From the base of the mountain & from fields around town, wherever I could get them. Sefton generally hauled from the
