This Mortgage made this twenty first day of December, in the year Eighteen Hundred and Sixty Five, by and between Baker H. Simmons and Theresa A. Simmons, his wife, of Frederick County, in the State of Maryland, Witnesses, that in consideration of the sum of Two Thousand three hundred dollars now due and owing from the said Baker H. Simmons to James H. Simmons of said County, upon a Promissory note bearing even date herewith and payable twelve months after date with interest from date, and for the better securing the Payment thereof with interest thereon, to the said James H. Simmons, according to the tenor of said Promissory note, we the said Baker H. Simmons and Theresa A. Simmons his wife, do grant unto the said James H. Simmons, all those three tracts, parts of tracts or parcels of land, and premises, situate lying and being in Frederick County, Maryland, and now in the occupancy of the said Baker H. Simmons, containing in the aggregate one hundred and forty seven acres, two rods and twenty one perches, the first tract containing one hundred
