

- 2^o Int: Look at the Assignment addressed on said Paper marked "H. G. W." and state in whose handwriting it is?
- Ans: I look at Paper marked "H. G. W." now has shown me. It is in the handwriting of Dr. William H. Wagon, the grantor in the same.
- 3^o Int: State what Payments, if any, have been made upon said Paper?
- Ans: There have been no Payments made on it since it came into my possession, and none other than those endorsed upon the back of the "Exhibit H. G. W." in ink, to wit: "April 2^o '69, \$30" "April 7th, '70 \$26" "Nov 23^o '70, \$40" The lead pencil mark "Apr. 2^o '69, for \$30, is a duplicate of the same item written in ink.
- 4th Int: State, if there are any sum or sums of Money, not credited on said Paper, which should be credits or credits on the same?
- Ans: There are none.
- 5th Int: What relation do you bear to this suit, and to the Paper of which "Exhibit A", is a copy?
- Ans: I am the Complainant in this suit and the Assignee of the Mortgage of which "Exhibit A", is a Copy.

To Cross-Interrogatories filed with the Commission by the Complainant and herewith returned, the said Harriet J. Welch, deposes and swears, to the -

- 1st C. Int: State what has been done with said Property since the assignment of the Property to you?
- Ans: It has been rented out until the first of the past April.
- 2^o C. Int: By whom has it been rented, and who was the landlord, and what was the price of rental?
- Ans: In 1874 Mrs. Fogle rented it to John Eyles at \$36. a year. She failed to furnish some manure for which she took off \$4. of the rent. In 1875, I rented it, with her consent, to Henry Smith for \$36. a year. and for the same amount of rent in 1876.
- 3^o C. Int: To whom were the rents paid?
- Ans: The rent of Eyles has never been paid. I have received from Smith \$47. rent, directly, or indirectly, which I have applied as per "Exhibit B." in accordance to the amount of both of the Defendants.
- 4th C. Int: When was not the balance of the rent collected from Smith?
- Ans: He gave his note for the balance of the rent to Mrs. Fogle, the defendant.
- 5th C. Int: When did he give the note?
- Ans: In April, 1877. He paid her few dollars (\$70.) which is charged in "Exhibit B."
- 6th C. Int: Was Jacob Fogle present when the note was given to Mrs. Fogle by Smith, and do you know, whether or not, he ever consented to such an arrangement?
