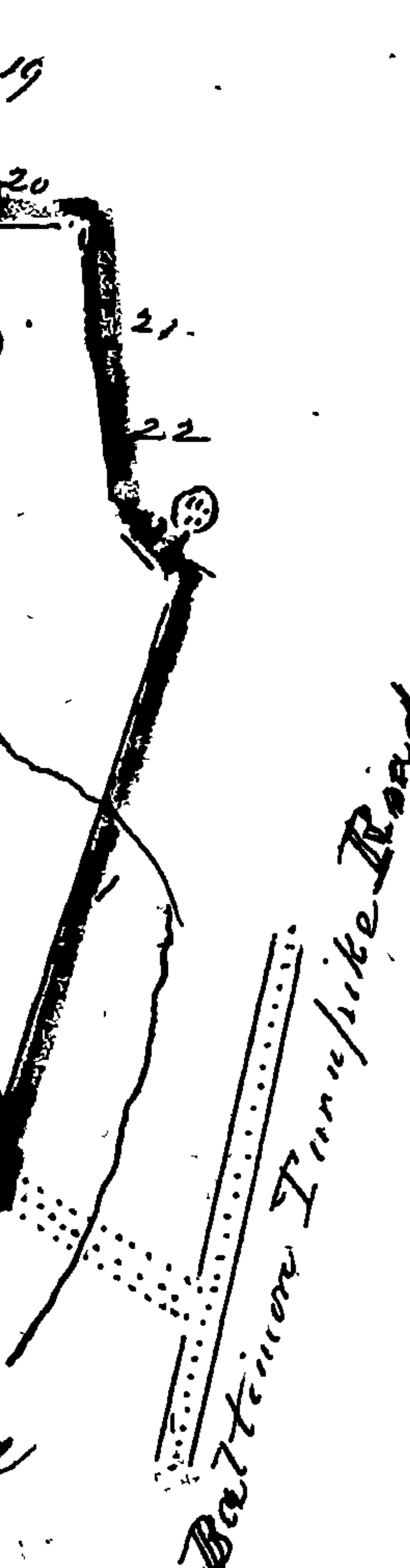

of said Hedges deed, correcting as aforesaid, S. 19° W. 42 furlongs to a stake, then N. 62° W. 61 7/10 furlongs to the middle of the Public road aforesaid, then with said road N. 36° E. 17 65/100 furlongs to the place of beginning, containing 10 acres, 2 roods and 37 furlongs.

Lot No. 2. Beginning at the end of the 2nd line of Lot No. 1. it being at the end of 42 furlongs on the 6th line of the deed from Adolphus Jackson and wife, to Emma Hedges, then with said 6th line, allowing for the magnetic variation, S. 19° W. 24 furlongs to a stake at the end thereof, then, South 28 1/4° W. 26 1/2 furlongs to a stake in the middle of a reserved road for the benefit of the 7 lots 16 1/2 feet wide, then with the middle of the said reserved road 2 courses and distances, N. 46° W. 30 furlongs to a stake, N. 25° W. 50 1/4 furlongs to the middle of the Public road leading from the Baltimore Turnpike across the Catoctin Mountain by the late Lawson Lighters' farm dwelling, then with said Public road, N. 48 1/4° E. 11 3/10 furlongs to the end of the 3rd line of Lot No. 1. then with said 3rd line reversed S. 62° E. 61 7/10 furlongs to the place of beginning, containing fourteen acres, two roods and eight square furlongs.

Lot No. 3. Beginning in the middle of the Public Road at the end of the 4th line of Lot No. 2. and running thence with said 4th line reversed, S. 25° E. 50 1/4 furlongs to a stake, then S. 45 3/4° W. 33 1/4 furlongs to a stake at the end of the 1st line of the part of said "Fieldena Manor", divided by George Smith to Dr. Grafton Claggett for 14 acres, 2 roods and 24 furlongs, then with the 2nd line of said Claggett's deed, allowing one degree for variation, N. 55 3/4° W. 25 1/2 furlongs to a stake, then N. 28° E. 25 4/10 furlongs to a stake, N. 64° W. 26 9/10 to the middle of the Public road leading from the Baltimore Turnpike across the Catoctin Mountain, it being at the end of the 4th line of the deed for 27 acres, 2 roods and 35 furlongs, from John Smith, of Jacob, and wife, to John Hagan, then with said road, and with the lines of Hagan's deed, N. 65 3/4° E. 18 7/10 furlongs, N. 77 1/2° E. 7 1/2 furlongs, N. 48 1/4° E. 15 1/2 furlongs to the place of beginning, containing 11 acres, 2 roods and 21 furlongs - The 1st line of this Lot (No. 3.) runs in the middle of a reserved road 16 1/2 feet wide, for the benefit of the seven lots.

Lot No. 4. Beginning in the Public road leading from the Baltimore Turnpike across the Catoctin Mountain, being at the end of the 3rd line of the deed from John Smith, of Jacob, and wife, to John Hagan for 29 acres, 2 roods and 35 furlongs of land, and running thence in the middle of said road, and with the 4th line of said Hagan's deed with a correction N. 61 1/2° E. 23 3/10 furlongs to the end of the 5th line of Lot No. 3. then with the lines of Lot No. 3. reversed two courses and distances, S. 64° E. 26 9/10 to a stake, S. 28° W. 25 4/10 furlongs to a stake in the 2nd line of the deed from George Smith to Dr. Grafton Claggett then with said 2nd line, with 1° for variation, N. 55 3/4° W. 40 furlongs to the place of beginning, containing 4 acres, 2 roods and 32 furlongs.

Lot No. 5. Beginning at a stake at the end of the 2nd line of Lot No. 3. it also being the end of the 2nd line of the deed from George Smith to John Hagan for 12 1/2 acres, part of "Fieldena Manor", and running thence with the 2nd line of Hagan's deed reversed, allowing one degree for variation, S. 55 3/4° E. 37 3/4 furlongs to a stake, then N. 55° E. 28 furlongs to a stake at the end of the 2nd line of Lot No. 2. and in the middle of a
