The Report of James M. Your Trustees further report that, at the same time and place, after having given due notice thereof by handbills extensively circulated, they sold the personal property of the said David Justice Dec'd., as the Schedule of sales of personal property herewith returned and filed with this report as a part thereof marked "Exhibit No. 2," and that the sales of said personal property amounted to the sum of One Hundred and One ⁹⁵/₁₀₀ Dollars.
