- 2<sup>d</sup> Interrogatory: Yes, He is dead. He died in the fall of 1873, in Frederick County, Maryland.
- 3<sup>d</sup> Interrogatory: He left a widow named Susannah R. Craver, and the following children, Lewis J. David S. Margant, married to Carlton Claud; Clara, married to Charles Claud; Mary and Cordelia, married to William Maechter, all adults and residing in Frederick County, Md., and Susan, Emma, Howard & Charles Craver, infants under twenty one years of age & all residing in Frederick County, Md.,
- 4<sup>th</sup> Interrogatory: I know the said lands - I look at "Exhibits Nos. 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, & 7," now here shown me - They are fully described in said Exhibits. "Exhibits Nos. 1 & 2," describe the mountain lots, and "Exhibits Nos. 4, 5, 6 & 7," describe the home farm. Said lands are situated in Frederick County, Md., about six miles north of Frederick City, and they are the same lands where he lived and died.
- 5<sup>th</sup> Interrogatory: I don't know if it was paid, except from Simon Peter Craver who said he had paid it, but had taken no receipt.
- 6<sup>th</sup> Interrogatory: They have not been paid, at least the heirs claim that they were not paid and there are no receipts to show that they have been paid. The family admit that they were not paid.
- 7<sup>th</sup> Interrogatory: I was acquainted with him - He is dead. He died in 1863, in Frederick County, Md., before Peter Craver, his father.
- 8<sup>th</sup> Interrogatory: He left the following children surviving, namely, Martha, now deceased, who was the wife of William Shawen, and Peter left the following children surviving her, namely: Elizabeth, married to - James, adult, and residing out of the State of Maryland; Lewis H. adult, and Viola S. David C. and Ann M. Shawen, infants under twenty one years of age, and Harriet Craver, adult, and all residing in Frederick County, Md.; George Craver, adult, and residing in Frederick County, Md., Charles Craver, adult, and residing out of the State of Maryland; Thomas Craver, adult, and residing out of the State of Maryland; Martin Craver, adult, and residing out of the State of Maryland; Phoebe, wife of Richard H. Harper, adult, and residing in Frederick County, Md., and Joshua Craver, adult, and residing out of the State of Maryland.
- 9<sup>th</sup> Interrogatory: Answered as to this deponent.
- 10<sup>th</sup> Interrogatory: It cannot be divided without loss and injury to the parties interested, as if divided, the parcels would be too small for advantageous cultivation or sale, and besides, the legacies must be paid out of it, which will necessitate a sale of it.
- 11<sup>th</sup> Interrogatory: It would be for the benefit and advantage of all parties interested, that said real estate should be sold and the proceeds thereof be distributed amongst the parties entitled for the same reasons as stated in my answer to the foregoing Interrogatory.
