I hereby certify that, I have carefully surveyed John H. Hillenry's
 Report of farm lying near Petersville Maryland and which comprises
 the most part of Lot No 6 part of The Reserve on Maryland
 as the same was formerly, on or about the 18th day of March 1817
 conveyed to Thomas Keilley by the State of Maryland for 300 acres
 of land. Beginning for the part thereof, which now constitutes
 said farm at the Original beginning of said Lot, to be, and
 running thence with the outlines thereof three courses cor-
 recting the same for Variation South $79^{\circ}30'$ degrees East, 130 perches
 to a bounded Black Oak tree the end of the 17th line of a tract of
 of land called Maryland South $23^{\circ}48'$ degrees West, 382 perches
 to a stone formerly planted North $81^{\circ}78'$ degrees West, 124 $\frac{1}{2}$
 perches to a stone formerly planted in the margin of the
 public road leading from Petersville to Burkettville it being a
 corner of John H. Poyer Lot, and with said lot, two courses
 and distances reversed North, 10 degrees East, 5 $\frac{3}{4}$ perches
 North $24^{\circ}30'$ degrees East 34 $\frac{8}{10}$ perches ending in said public
 road at or near the second line of N. B. Schroeder's farm part
 of Lot No 5, part of the Reserve on Maryland and thence with
 said second line reversed North 23° degrees East, 345 $\frac{7}{10}$ perches
 to the place of beginning containing Two hundred and ninety
 six acres and thirty seven square perches of land. And I
 have divided the same into two unequal parts distinguished
 as Lots No 1 & 2, as is fully shown by the accompanying plat
 herewith returned. Beginning for Lot, No 1 at the end of 231 $\frac{3}{4}$
 perches on the second line of the whole lot, and running thence
 with the outlines thereof five courses South $23^{\circ}48'$ degrees West,
 150 $\frac{6}{10}$ perches to a stone North $81^{\circ}78'$ degrees West, 124 $\frac{1}{2}$ perches
 to a stone North, 10 degrees East, 5 $\frac{3}{4}$ perches North $24^{\circ}30'$ degrees
 East, 34 $\frac{8}{10}$ perches North 23° degrees East 137 $\frac{8}{10}$ perches then
 South 70° degrees East, 23 perches to the place of beginning,
 containing One hundred and twenty five acres of land Begin-
 ning for Lot, No 2, at the beginning of the whole lot and running
 thence with the outlines thereof two courses South, $79^{\circ}30'$ degrees
 East, 130 perches to a bounded Black Oak tree South, $23^{\circ}48'$
 degrees West, 231 $\frac{3}{4}$ perches then North, 70° degrees West, 123 perches
 intersecting the closing line of the whole lot or farm at the end of 137 $\frac{8}{10}$
 perches and thence with said line North, 23° degrees East, 207 $\frac{3}{4}$
 perches to the place of beginning containing One hundred and
 seventy one acres and thirty seven square perches of land,
