This Indenture made this thirty first day of March in the year
 of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty six between
 John S. Motter of Frederick County and State of Maryland of the one
 part and Joseph Stup of the County and State of Virginia of the other
 part Witnesseth that the said John S. Motter for and in consideration
 of the sum of Three thousand and Seven Dollars and twenty three
 cents current money to him in hand paid to the said Joseph Stup
 at and before the making and delivery of these presents the receipt
 whereof is hereby acknowledged hath granted bargained sold
 aliened conveyed and confirmed and by these presents doth
 grant bargain sell alien convey and confirm unto the said
 Joseph Stup his heirs and assigns all that lot or parcel
 of land distinguished as lot number two lying & being in the
 County and State aforesaid being part of a tract of land
 called "Hildreth's" being part of the lot for forty seven and
 one third acres Deed by John H. Williams and others Executors
 to Henry Motter by Deed dated the twenty ninth day of Novem-
 ber 1811 beginning at the end of the 1st line of lot No one being
 a stake near a marked white oak tree it being at the end of
 twenty perches on the third line north sixty two degrees West thirty
 eight perches then north twenty eight and the eighth degrees
 East forty nine and six tenths perches to the end of eighty four
 and a half perches on the first line of the whole lot aforesaid
 for forty seven and a third acres then with said line south sixty
 two degrees East thirty eight perches to the end of the second
