This Mortgage made this sixteenth day of February in the year Eighteen Hundred and Seventy two by John H. Fogle and Catharine A. Fogle his wife both of Frederick County, Maryland Witnesses that whereas the said John H. Fogle now stands indebted to Mary E. Albaugh of the same County, and State aforesaid in the sum of One Thousand Six Hundred Dollars and also stands indebted to Christina Smith, of the same County, and State aforesaid in the sum of one thousand two hundred dollars now then fore in consideration of the premises and for the better securing the payment of the aforesaid sums of money with interest thereon from the date of the said John H. Fogle and Catharine A. Fogle his wife do grant unto the said Mary E. Albaugh and Christina Smith, all that lot or parcel of land situated in Frederick County, Maryland to the North West of Liberty Town which was conveyed to the said John H. Fogle by Andrew Anders by deed dated the second day of February in the year 1872, and recorded in Liber C.
