5th Interrogatory: have you in your possession the papers referred to in your last answer? If you are the endorser or are telling you speak of in writing?

Answer: yes I have them in my possession of course they are in writing.

6th Interrogatory: Produce them if you please?

Answer: I decline to produce them.

7th Interrogatory: Do you know of your own knowledge that the papers mentioned by you in your deposition were ever filed in the Circuit Court for Carroll County?

Answer: No further than I have stated.

8th Interrogatory: Are your only reasons for supposing it to have been filed the fact that you found it among the papers you have mentioned in your answer to the 4th (cross) Interrogatory?

Answer: Yes I found it among the papers endorsed in writing "No. 1517 Equity" Exhibit B. Filed January 4th 1875."

9th Interrogatory: How is it endorsed?

Answer: - In writing

10th Interrogatory: Please produce it?

Answer: I shall decline to do it.

11th Interrogatory: State every word & figure on said paper whether on the side on which it is endorsed or on the opposite side?

Answer: I shall decline to do so.

12th Interrogatory: Have you any knowledge whatever as to how said paper came out of the possession of the Circuit Court for Carroll County?

Answer: I have no knowledge on the subject I have suspicion but no knowledge.
