Hammond his Executor to administer upon said estate, but this Petitioner says that said Personal Estate was totally insufficient to discharge the aforesaid indebtedness whereupon the Complainants herein have filed their Bill of Complaint in the above case praying for a sale of said Real estate to satisfy their demands and the claims of all others who would come into this case and be made parties hereto, your Petitioner now avers that said Thomas Hammond was at the time of his death indebted to your Petitioner in the sum of Three hundred and Thirty six dollars and Seventy five cents, on which your Petitioner has received a small dividend from the administration of said Personal property, but that a large proportion of said indebtedness is still due and owing to your Petitioner and your Petitioner is advised that he is a proper party to this suit, he therefore prays your Honors to pass an order herein making your Petitioner a party complainant, to this suit, and as in duty bound.
