

Answer: Well a few Weeks before she was sold out, in Littleton Pennsylvania Adam Black held a note with the Security against me for fifty Dollars and he also held one against Mrs Thomas Devilliss with her name on as Security, for \$180 - when she was about to be sold out Adam Black went to her with a note, waiving exemption with my amount and Tom's mediation he told her if she would sign that note, he would save her the \$300 which the law allowed her in Pennsylvania. After she signed it he then gave her my note, and Tom's note - After her property was sold there was seventy two dollars (72<sup>00</sup>) and some cents coming to her and Adam Black told me last Summer that he took 50<sup>00</sup> of it on my note, and credited the balance to Tom, (Excepting to by Defendant)

3<sup>rd</sup> Interrogatory: Did you then include that 50<sup>00</sup> in the credit you gave on your wife's Mortgage?

Answer: Yes Sir.

4<sup>th</sup> Interrogatory: What other items besides this 50<sup>00</sup> make up the credit of \$150 on the Mortgage?

Answer: Fifty Dollars (\$50) she loaned me after I sold ten (10) acres of ground for her in 1876 - I owed Thomas Kennerford a note of \$115. My sister was working there for him and he gave her a note to mother against me for fifty Dollars (\$50) which mother paid for me the balance of Kennerford's note I paid myself - I boarded his son who was going to school.

5<sup>th</sup> Interrogatory: Do you know anything about a judgment which S. C. Simmonds recovered against you and your mother and which she testified she paid amounting to \$60.35?

Answer: I do not.

6<sup>th</sup> Interrogatory: Did said Simmonds ever have any claim against you?

Answer: No, Sir not to my knowledge - never knew him.

7<sup>th</sup> Interrogatory: Do you know anything about a note for \$89.36 purporting to be payable by you to your mother and returned by John H. Leitchall made in 1868?

Answer: No Sir, I do not.

8<sup>th</sup> Interrogatory: Where was the mortgage made "Exhibit. C." made by your mother to your wife, on June 23<sup>rd</sup> 1876 signed by your mother and acknowledged?

Answer: At Godfrey Knut's office at the Market House

9<sup>th</sup> Interrogatory: Was that mortgage read over to your mother before it was signed? If so by whom and when?

Answer: Yes it was by Frank Beugle on the same day that she signed it and that she signed Mr Smith's and Alex Beugle's Mortgages at my house.
