

Answer: Well, I am not sure and some he paid me.
 6th Interrogatory: How much did he give you for the Mortgage?

Answer: The full face of it - outside of the credits of \$150.
 7th Interrogatory: How much of that was in cash and how much was
 to pay a previous debt?

Answer: Well I can't just tell you the amount.

8th Interrogatory: You stated in your testimony in chief you
 afterwards told your Mother that you had included
 in the mortgage compensation for your trouble and expense how long
 was it after the Mortgage was executed before you told her that?

Answer: Well I can't just exactly tell you it was a few weeks.

Laura L. Devilbiss, a witness of lawful age produced upon the
 part of the complainant being duly sworn in Rebuttal and exam-
 ined to Interrogatories filed with the Commissioner by the complainant
 and her wife, returned the following and says to the

1st Interrogatory: Did Mrs Maria Devilbiss ever pay you any-
 thing on this Mortgage "Exhibible"?

Answer: No Sir.

2^d Interrogatory: Do you know whether she was supported
 by your husband at any time? If so for how
 long? What were his services in this behalf worth and was
 he paid for them?

Answer: Yes Sir I do - for about two years his services were worth
 Fifty dollars (50) a year - Fifty dollars a year would
 be a very small sum he has not been paid for them.

3^d Interrogatory: Did you ever have any conversation with
 Isaac Thomas Devilbiss in relation to this
 Mortgage? If so when and what did he say?

Answer: Yes Sir. I had conversations with him at different
 times - one time in particular, when he was standing
 in my husband's meat store in October 1876. He had been
 home to his dinner and after dinner we were speaking
 about this mortgage - He said that we needn't be uneasy about
 this mortgage he said it was running on interest and as
 soon as they could get the money they would pay it.

4th Interrogatory: Did you have any conversation with Mrs
 Madam Devilbiss relative to this Mortgage?

If so when was it and what did she say?

Answer: I did on the 19th day of July 1876. She told me
 that she knew all about the mortgage that she had given
 to us I told her that I had saw the mortgage that it was for
 four hundred dollars (\$400) she said "Oh Yes" I know all
 about it - And then she spoke of the Brough Mortgage she said
 that Danny had not money enough to pay up the Court fees and
 they had to borrow some money from Mr. Brough I asked her if
 it was the lawyer Brough and she said it was his Cousin she
