Willian, of the State of Illinois, respectfully sheweth, that Israel Willian, late of Frederick County, State of Maryland, deceased, died intestate in the month of December, in the year Eighteen hundred and seventy three, seized and possessed in fee, of all those pieces or parcels of tracts of Land situate in Frederick County, State of Maryland, described in the Plat and table of Courses and distances, and Copies of deeds herewith Exhibit ed marked Exhibits 1. 2. 3. 4. 5. 6. 7. 8. 9. 10. supposed to contain Ninety five acres of Land more or less, which Exhibits Your Complainants pray may be taken as part of this their Bill of Complaint Your Complainants further state that, said Israel Willian left a widow named Lavinia Willian, and the following Children to whom said lands descended as tenants in Common, to wit:

1. Samuel Willian a son living in Illinois.
2. Josiah Willian a son living in Idaho
3. George W. Willian a son living in Illinois
4. John F. Willian a son living in Illinois, who with their wives, are the Complainants in this Bill
5. David F. Willian a son married to Catharine
6. Cornelius A. Willian a son married to Harriet.
7. Ann Margaret Willian a daughter
8. Mary Ann, a daughter now wife of Samuel Morhead.
9. James Calvin Willian a son - all of whom are defendants and all of full age, and reside in Frederick County, State of Maryland.

Your Complainants further state that the said lands and tenements whereof the said Israel Willian died seized. And possessed, cannot be divided without loss or injury to the parties interested, and that the interest of all parties concerned require that the said lands be sold under a decree of this Court for the purpose of partition
