At the Request of Henry A. Freshour the following deed was recorded November 19th 1860.
This deed made this 19th day of November in the year 1860 Witnesseth that in Peter G. Schliefer Executor of the last Will and Testament of George Schliefer late of Frederick County State of Maryland deceased, under a power in said will contained and an order of the Orphans Court of the said County referred in consideration of the sum of One Hundred and Eighty Seven dollars and sixty two Cents here bargained and sold, and do hereby grant in fee simple unto Henry A. Freshour of said County & State all that parcel of land being part of a tract of land called "The Runny or Miller's Chance" or be it part of any other tract or tracts whatsoever and contained within the following metes & bounds courses and distances, to wit, Beginning for the same at a stone planted in the middle of the County Road leading from the Frederick and Mechanics town turnpike being at the North East corner of said lot being also a corner of Henry A. Freshour's land and running thence with said land South 5 3/8 West 69 perches
