



At the request of John W. England the
Following Deed was recorded April 8th 1870,
This deed made this 11 day of February, in the year Eighteen Hundred and Seventy
by me Abram Partgis Sheriff of Frederick County Maryland. Witnesseth that
by virtue of an Execution issued out of the Circuit Court for Frederick County
and dated the 17th day of December, in the year Eighteen Hundred and Sixty nine
in the case of James Long, vs. Catharine Sechliden, I the said Abram Partgis as
Sheriff of said County, have sold to John W. England in consideration of Six
Hundred and Thirty seven Dollars the Following Property, being part of a tract
of land called "Middle Plantation" beginning at the point hereby conveyed
at the end of one hundred and Twenty three and one third perches on fifth
line of road of said "Middle Plantation", which was on or about the 17th day
of May 1774, conveyed by Thomas Peatty to William Peatty, and running
thence North two and one fourth degrees East eleven and nine tenths perches to a
stone planted, thence North Eighty seven and three fourths degrees west twelve and six
tenths perches, thence South Eight and one half degrees west seven and three tenths
perches, thence South Eighty degrees East, twelve and nine tenths perches to the
beginning, containing three fourths of an acre of land, more or less, with all the im-
provements thereon. Now, therefore I the said Abram Partgis Sheriff of the County afores-
said, do grant unto the said John W. England all the right, title & interest of Cath-
arine Sechliden, in and to the heretofore described property.
