 do severally acknowledge the said indenture or instrument of writing
 to be their respective act and deed: And that said Ann C. Schley
 signed and sealed said indenture before me out of the presence
 and hearing of her husband; and the said Ann C. Schley, being
 thus Examined out of the presence and hearing of her said husband
 whether she doth execute and acknowledge the same fully and vol-
 untarily and without being induced to do so by fear of threats
 of or ill usage by her husband or by fear of this displeasure, de-
 clareth and saith that she doth.

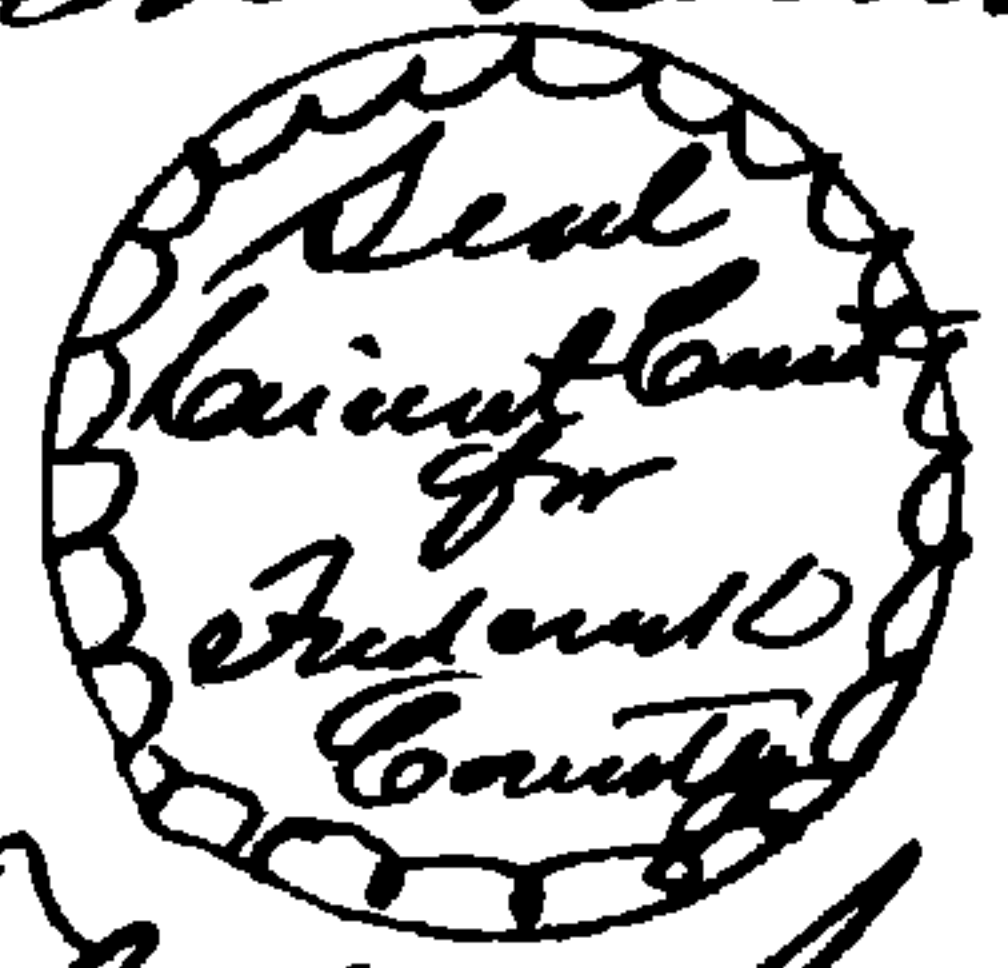

At the request of John W. Miller the following
 Deed is Recorded Oct. 28th, 1833.

This Indenture, made the 20th day of July in the year of our
 Lord 1833, between Henry Keller of Frederick County, in the State of
 Maryland, of the one part and John W. Miller of the same County
 and State aforesaid, of the other part Whereas, by a decree of
 the Chancery Court of Frederick County, sitting as a Court of Equity,
 in the State aforesaid, bearing date the 19th day of Jan. in the
 year of our Lord 1832, the above named Henry Keller was
 appointed a trustee and authorized and empowered to sell and
 dispose of the real estate of Jacob Durr, late of Frederick County,
 for the payment of his debt that in pursuance of the decree the
 said Henry Keller did on the 16th day of Feb. in the year 1832,
 aforesaid, sell and dispose of to the above named John W. Miller
 all that lot or part of lots or portions of ground situate lying
 and being in Frederick Town, in the County aforesaid being the
 same lots or parts of lots conveyed to the said Jacob Durr by
 Philip Rohr and George Littlejohn, known and distinguished
 by No. 103, at and for the sum of Five hundred and Eighty,
