Socks his wife of Frederick County and Susie Cook of Carroll County, Commanding them to be & appear in your Honorable Court on some certain day to be therein named to answer the Premises and to obey and perform such Order or Decree as may be passed in the premises.

At the Request of James Cook the Following Deed  
was recorded January 22<sup>nd</sup> 1842.

This Indenture made this first day of September one thousand Eight hundred and forty one between John Fittling and Elizabeth Fittling his wife of Frederick County Maryland of the one part and James Cook of the County and State aforesaid of the other part.

Witnesseth, that the said John Fittling and Elizabeth Fittling for
