Krausman Deceased, and of Joseph Lorentz Administrator of John Lorentz Deceased  
in behalf of themselves and all other Creditors of John Lorentz Deceased, who will  
file their Claims and contribute to the expenses of this proceeding respectfully  
represent That a certain John Lorentz was at the time of his death indebted  
unto your Complainers Levy & Successors in the sum of five dollars upon open  
account, and also in the sum of Eighty one Dollars & twenty six cents with interest  
from 29 of December 1873, by his single Bill or note under seal, both of which  
Claims have been duly proven and passed by the Circuit Court for Frederick  
County, and are herewith filed as part hereof marked Exhibits Nos 1 and 2 to  
Petition of Creditors, that said John Lorentz was also at the time of his death in-  
debted unto your Petitioners D. Edward Krausman and Richard C. Krausman  
Executors of Daniel Krausman Deceased in the sum of Forty six Dollars, which  
Claim has been duly passed by the said Circuit Court and will hereafter be  
filed - that he was also indebted at the time of his death to Herman L. Potz-  
atom in the sum of Nine and <sup>00</sup>/<sub>100</sub> Dollars, Hermann Remsburg in the sum of  
Forty seven dollars, to Thomas Strafer in the sum of Eight and <sup>00</sup>/<sub>100</sub> dollars  
to Mahlon Remsburg in the sum of ten and <sup>00</sup>/<sub>100</sub> dollars, to Ezra Dorn in the sum of  
Forty six and <sup>00</sup>/<sub>100</sub> Dollars all of which are still unpaid And to other persons  
as will appear from the copy of administration account herewith filed Marked Exhibit  
No 3, to Petition of Creditors, that the Personal Estate of said John Lorentz was  
insufficient to pay all his just debts, and that the deficiency ought to be supplied  
out of the proceeds of sale of said Real Estate, that the Personal Property has been  
administered and that the administrator, namely your Petitioners Joseph  
Lorentz, had unpaid said Personal Estate all of which and the details of which  
will appear fully from said Exhibit No 3.

Your Petitioners further state that the proceeds of the Real Estate described in  
the proceedings in their cause are more than sufficient to pay the Mortgage  
under which the same was sold and the costs, and that the surplus pro-  
ceeds of sale ought to be applied to the Payment of the debts of said John  
Lorentz  
Your Petitioners further state that the heirs at Law, of said  
John Lorentz are a sister Mary E. Lorentz, a sister Anna Lorentz, a bro-  
ther Joseph Lorentz, a sister Eliza Brady, a sister Malinda E. Conner, wife  
of George V. Conner, a Brother Adam Lorentz, all adults residing in Frederick  
County, and the children of a Dec<sup>d</sup> Brother George Lorentz, namely Martha  
wife of William Wright adults who live in Washington County and Cardin Lorentz
