Answer of Margaret Fogle, widow of David Fogle, late of Frederick County, State of Maryland, deceased, to the Original and Amended Bill of Complaint of Isaac Fogle and Barbara Fogle, his wife, filed in the Circuit Court for Frederick County, as a Court of Equity, against herself and others. This defendant for answer to said Original and amended Bill of Complaint, answers and says: - That she admits that David Fogle died as stated in said Bill, seized and possessed in fee simple, of the lands in said Proceedings mentioned, leaving your respondent his widow entitled to dower in said lands, and that dying without issue intestate, that said lands described, to his brother and sisters as stated subject to the dower of your respondent. Your respondent claims that she is entitled to dower in said Prem.
