Complaint

To the Honorable the Judges of the Circuit Court for Fred-
ericks County sitting in Equity

The Bill of Complaint of Edmund C. Cartzendafner of Frederick's County State of Maryland, respectfully shows to your Honors, that on or about the Eighteenth day of June in the year Eighteen hundred and sixty six your complainant and his brother Joseph C. Cartzendafner entered into copartnership for the purpose of conducting the milling business in Frederick County State of Maryland, and in buying and selling grain corn and all other produce, appertaining to the milling business under the name style and firm of J. C. Cartzendafner & Bro. That said contract of Copartnership was verbal and without limitation as to its duration, and that each partner was equally interested in the property and affairs of said Copartnership, and were to share equally in its profits and losses. Your complainant further states, that at the present time the assets and property of the said Copartnership, consist of goods and chattels grain in the mills rights and credits for grain of in and other produce sold, and also book accounts notes and other choses in action in amount in value of about Five thousand dollars, and also of two flour mills with all the rights privileges ways water, water courses and appurtenances thereunto appertaining, situate in Frederick's County, State of Maryland, one situate on the waters of Carroll Creek on the road leading from Frederick to the Monocacy River at Campbells ford adjoining the lands of James Gladhill, George M. Polts and others and fully described in the deed from William H. Bowers and wife to your Complainant and the said Joseph C. Cartzendafner and the other situate in the village of New London Frederick's County and fully described in the deed from Henry Baker mortgage to your Complainant and the said Joseph C. Cartzendafner certified copies of which are here with Exhibited and marked Exhibits Nos. 1 and 2 which your Complainant prays together with all other Exhibits here in after produced may be taken and considered as part of this Bill of Complaint Which said property however is subject to a mortgage executed by said Copartnership to a certain Thomas St. Harwood to secure an indebtedness of Eight thousand dollars a certified copy of which is also Exhibited as Exhibit No 3.

Your complainant further states that in the management and conducting of the said copartnership business your complainant conducted and operated the mill and all the business appertaining thereto, situate in the village of New London aforesaid. And the said Joseph C. Cartzendafner conducted and operated the mill situated on the waters of Carroll Creek on the road leading from Frederick to the Monocacy River at Campbells Ford, and that each partner using the firm name would buy wheat corn and other grain manufacture flour, and ship the same to Commission merchants in Baltimore and elsewhere, as the exigencies of the trade might require, and draw drafts on the said, commission men for the proceeds of the sale of the same. that said copartnership was thus conducted and continued
