The object of this suit is to procure a de-
cree for a dissolution of the copartnership of the firm of J. E. Cartzen-
dafner & P. M. and for the appointment of a receiver.

The bill states that on or about the eighteenth of June, 1865, the
Complainant and defendant entered into copartnership for the pur-
pose of conducting the millinery business in Frederick County, State of
Maryland, under the name, style and firm of J. E. Cartzendafner
& P. M.; that the said contract of Copartnership was verbal and without
limitation as to its duration, and that each partner had an equal in-
terest in the partnership property, and were to share equally in its loss-
es and profits, that at the time of filing this bill the partnership prop-
erty consisted of personal chattels, rights, credits, stocks in trade, book ac-
counts and other choses in action, to an amount equal in value to ap-
proximately five thousand dollars, and two mill properties situate in Freder-
ick County, State of Maryland - One situate on the road leading from
Frederick to the Monocacy River at Campbells Ford, and one in the
village of New London, that the said partnership was conducted
from the time it was formed down to the latter part of the month of May,
1879 when Joseph E. Cartzendafner absconded and left the State of
Maryland, having by his mismanagement of the business of said firm
involved the same in financial ruin, and is now insolvent and unable
to pay its indebtedness; that the said Joseph E. Cartzendafner has, with-
out the knowledge of the Complainant, involved the partnership in li-
abilities largely in excess of the assets of the firm, and has acted in such
manner as to endanger and involve in financial ruin the said firm,
and in constant violation of his duties and obligations as a member of said
firm, and that unless the said firm is dissolved may still further involve
