It is thereupon adjudged, ordered and decreed, ^{that} the complainant, by causing a copy of this order to be inserted in some newspaper published in Frederick County, once a week in each of four successive weeks before the ninth day of August next, give notice to the said absent defendant of the object and substance of this bill, and warn him to appear in this Court in person, or by solicitor on or before the fifteenth day of September next, to answer the premises and show cause (if any he has) why a decree ought not to pass as prayed

Receivers

On the foregoing Bill filed in this Cause and the Exhibits thereto upon this fifth day of July in the year Eighteen hundred and seventy nine, by the Circuit Court for Frederick County sitting in Equity Ordered that Thomas Clafett and Elias Zimmerman of Frederick County be and they are hereby appointed receivers with power and authority to take charge and possession of the property, goods rights credits, franchises and effects of or belonging to the said firm of J. E. Cartzendorfner & Bro., and to collect and receive all moneys and outstanding debts due to the said firm, and the said Joseph E. Cartzendorfner and the said Edmund C. Cartzendorfner and each of them are hereby required to yield up and deliver to the said Thomas Clafett and Elias Zimmerman the property goods wares and merchandise books papers and effects of said firm subject nevertheless to the further order of this Court.

And it is further ordered that before the said Thomas Clafett and Elias Zimmerman proceed to act as receivers by virtue of this order they give Bond to the State of Maryland in the penalty of Forty thousand dollars with a surety or sureties to be approved by the Court or the Clerk thereof and conditioned for the faithful performance of the trust reposed in them by this order, or which may be reposed in them by any future decree or order in the premises and the said Thomas Clafett and Elias Zimmerman after they have collected all moneys and outstanding debts due said firm and after they have disposed of all the partnership effects and converted them into money, shall report the same to this Court for its further orders.
