Receiver's
Report

To the Honorable, the Judges of the Circuit Court for Frederick County sitting in Equity

The report of Thomas Claxett and Elias Jinnemann, receivers of the firm of J. C. Cartzendafner & Pro appointed by order of your Honorable Court dated, July 5th 1879 respectfully report to your Honor that Edmund C. Cartzendafner the remaining partner of said firm in obedience to the order of your Honorable Court, has handed over to us the said Thomas Claxett and Elias Jinnemann receivers as aforesaid personal chattels and property belonging to said firm to the extent in value of about seven hundred and Eighteen dollars and twenty five cents \$718.25

And said receivers further report, that the said firm by their Commission men in Baltimore City have made sales of a large amount of wheat and flour, but as yet have made no return of sales but have been notified to make return to said receivers

And the said receivers further report that they have also received the books of account of said firm showing the amount of debts one said firm - all of which appears by an inventory of the personal Chattels and an inventory of lists of debts, herewith returned and filed, which said receivers pray may be taken and considered as part of this their report and have herewith marked the same Exhibit A - as part of this their report. And said receivers further report that the said Edmund C. Cartzendafner the remaining partner as aforesaid has placed them also in possession of the two mills - mentioned and described in the Bill of Complaint filed in this Cause.

And said receivers further represent unto your Honor, that it will be to the interest and advantage to the Creditors of said firm that the personal chattels and property belonging to said firm - and the well properties mentioned aforesaid be sold as soon as possible - and the proceeds of the sale distributed among the creditors of said firm - that a large portion of the personal chattels received by them is of a perishable nature, and in expensive to keep - and unless sold immediately will deteriorate and become lost - And that the mills are now idle, and is deemed advisable to sell at once, so they may be prepared and put in order for the purpose of grinding & milling the present crop of grain - That said mills - are covered by a mortgage executed by the members of said firm to a certain Thomas N. Harwood - and that the said Thomas N. Harwood the mortgage aforesaid has agreed in writing that said mills may be sold by said receivers under the orders of your Honorable Court provided the purchase money be applied to the payment of his mortgaged debt and interest as appears from the said agreement herewith filed with this report as Exhibit B.

And said receivers further state that will be for the interest and advantage of the general Creditors of said firm that the said mills should be sold by said receivers upon credit - rather than for Cash, as in the judg-
