Order of Publication

The object of this suit is to procure a decree for the sale of certain real estate situated in Frederick County of which William C. Powell and Christanna M. Powell died seized and possessed. - The Bill states that said Wm C. Powell late of Frederick County died intestate in the year 1860 seized & possessed of about fourteen acres of land situated in said County & described in two deeds of Conveyance to said William Powell, One from Cornelius Ridge & wife, and the other from Henry S. Leuhart & wife, certified copies of which have been duly filed with the Bill of Complaint & marked Exhibits Nos. 1 & 3; that said William Powell died leaving the following as his only children & heirs at law; viz.

- 1st, Charles Powell, a son who died intestate about the year 1873, unmarried and without children.
- 2d, Florence Roberts, a daughter, wife of John Roberts & who died intestate, about the year 1875, leaving the said John surviving her & leaving William Roberts & Elizabeth Roberts as her only children & heirs at law.
- 3d, Wallace B. Powell, a son, who died intestate in October A. D. 1878, unmarried and without children
